



High Adventure Training

Our training courses are designed to help prepare the new Trek Leader for taking scouts into the wilderness and provide updated information for the veteran Trek Leader. Basic Backpacking classroom training is followed with a day hike to provide field experience with map and compass and a weekend overnight hike to let you experience what you've been told about. This training is offered twice a year, the last weekend of February and the last weekend of September. Winter Backpack training is put on in January. Award Objectives


- Increase retention in scouting

General Requirements

- Awards must be earned: One trip, one award
- All recipients must be BSA or other youth organization registered
- Awards must be earned with unit/council
- BSA Activity Plan filed in advance
- All other permits (USFS, NPS, etc) received
- Minimum 2 adults (1>21, 2-deep leadership) & 2 youth/trip
- 1 adult must have appropriate HAT training
- 1 adult must be CPR/First Aid trained, Hazardous Wx, WFA if >2 hrs
- Leaders should be familiar with BSA literature, including Trek Aids
- High Adventure Award Application submitted
- Parental consent forms & BSA Physical forms
- All adults must have YPT
- Follow Leave No Trace
- See current HAT Awards Booklet requirements for updates

- Designed to fulfill Tenderfoot,
 2nd Class & 1st Class skills




Animal Tracks

- Complete a day hike of at least 5 miles
- Each Scout keeps a logbook listing at least 10 animals or evidence (tracks, spoor, etc) seen
- Logbook must be submitted within 3 months
- Scouts will show first aid for:
 - Insect & tick bites & stings
 - Rattlesnake bites

Home Town Historic Sites

Inland Empire Council

- Designed to promote awareness of community history
- May be earned by Cub, Boy & Girl Scouts, adult leaders
- Comply with all HAT General Requirements
- Contact HAT member or local community historical society for appropriate sites to visit
- Prepare a list of local sites of interest to your unit
- Complete a 5+ mile hike or 15+ mile cycle to visit 5 or more historic sites from your list
- Prepare a written hike/trek report including date, participant names, route, equipment, site descriptions & submit with application



Soaring Award Inland Empire Council

- Watch award videos (2)
- Know & understand:
 - Thermal lift
 - Ridge lift
 - Wave lift



- Write a report explaining how pilot uses these
- Comply with HAT General Requirements

- Complete a HAT Award Application form
- Submit the form to the sponsoring council with appropriate payment
- Distribute awards to participants
